Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Appleview Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about accountability, student assessment, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Because Appleview Elementary strives for every student's success, our staff is working to close the achievement gaps in math and reading. Appleview staff are working to align their standards and instruction as well to fully implement the Professional Learning Team process. The process involves working as grade level teams to determine what is the most essential standards, reviewing our student progress on those standards and remediating or accelerating students as necessary.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Appleview serves the students of the Sparta Area School District in grade 3, 4 and 5.



2. Appleview continues to grow in the use of the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support Process (MTSS). Reading teams have been added to the already established behavior teams to increase the effectiveness of our systems.
3. Appleview follows the Common Core State Standards and uses common Tier I, Tier II and Tier III math and literacy resources across all grade levels. You can assess a copy of the curriculum and a description of its implementation by emailing steve.johnson2@spartaschools.org
