Celebration Time for the Sparta Education Foundation!

In many ways, June is my favorite time of year. Not because I am a former teacher who still looks forward to summer break, (although I do!), but because it is a time to celebrate the accomplishments of our students and the people who have supported them. This includes families, school staff, and financial donors to the Sparta Education Foundation.

The mission of the Sparta Education Foundation is "To ignite the potential for enhanced learning through financial support." The SEF is able to accomplish our mission only because of our financial partners in the community. These monetary gifts are used to provide teacher grants for classroom materials and learning experiences that otherwise are not covered in the budget. The innovative teacher ideas impact SAS students at every grade level and cover STEM, arts, health and wellness, literacy, socialemotional growth, and even parent and teacher education.

Because of the generosity of our donors, the SEF was able to fund 112 mini classroom grants, 17 grants for classroom initiatives and health and wellness goals, and 4 transportation grants for a total of nearly \$50,000! Your giving has made the following grants possible.

 Display frames for high school artists to display their work and provide beauty to a forgotten hall.
 Large interactive classroom manipulatives called Nuggets for our youngest students to learn cooperation and moveable play.

- 3-D printers to be used by middle school science, tech and math students.
- A parent lending library to support parents of our youngest students.
- A camera-equipped drone which allows our high school tech and media classes to create amazing content.
- Lots and lots of books allowing our students at every level to access print and to see themselves in literature.
- A school-wide performance of Suessical the Musical performed by our high school thespians for Appleview Elementary.
- An interactive light table

for experiential learning for our young scholars.Brain lab to support hands-on learning for high school science and psych students.

- Fishing equipment to support the middle school fishing club providing a noncompetitive extracurricular activity and life-long skills.
- Guest steel pan musical artist for our 3-4-5 graders which allows them to experience Caribbean culture and music.
- Summer professional book club for teachers
- Incentives for all students and staff who participated in a district-wide wellness challenge.
- Bard to Go a program which will bring Shakespeare to our high school students in the fall of 2024.
